Why did Philip leave Jerusalem, and where did he go? **Read Acts 8:1-5**.

Who did Philip obey by going there? Read Acts 1:8.

In Bible times, Jews disliked Samaritans—yet Jesus told a parable with a Samaritan as the hero! What did Jesus want people to learn from this story? **Read Luke 10:30-37**.

Is there anyone in the world who should not hear about Jesus? **Read Mark 16:15.** 

**PRAY** Dear Jesus, help us humbly obey Your call to serve You, no matter what You ask us to do and where You ask us to go. Amen.



# MOTIVES

Was Chris excited about the new invention so he could help others—or so he could impress people and make money? **Read Luke 12:15.** 

What kind of person was Simon in Samaria? Read Acts 8:9-11.

When Peter and John prayed for people to receive the Holy Spirit, how did Simon respond? **Read Acts 8:17-19**.

What did Peter say was wrong with Simon? Read Acts 8:20-23.

The Bible warns against being greedy, jealous and proud. How can we guard against these things? **Read James 4:1-10**.

**PRAY** Father, keep us from pride and greed. Help us to be humble and to glorify You in all that we say and do. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.



# WITNESSING

Things were going well for Philip in Samaria—so why did he leave? **Read Acts 8:26.** 

Imagine if Philip had said he was too busy or too comfortable to go! What happened because he obeyed? **Read Acts 8:27-40**.

The Ethiopian man was reading a prophecy written over 600 years before Christ was born. Who is the prophecy describing? **Read Isaiah 53:3-11.** 

Why does God give His followers power—for their glory or for His? **Read Mark 16:20**.

What are some ways we can tell people about Jesus today? Read 1 Peter 4:10-11, Romans 1:16, and John 13:34-35.

**PRAY** Lord Jesus, thank You for dying on the cross to pay the price for our sins, then rising again to give us eternal life! Amen.
