

Chris and Joy are good friends—so why did he get very angry at her? When we get mad, it's easy to say or do the wrong thing.

King Solomon was one of the wisest people in the world, and he gave good advice about anger. Read Proverbs 15:18 and Proverbs 29:11.

What is a birthright, and why did Jacob want it? What do you think Esau was thinking when he sold his birthright for a bowl of stew? What is the most precious possession you own, and would you trade it for a sandwich—even if you were really hungry at the moment?

Jesus talks about storing up our treasures in heaven. Read Luke 12:34. What does this mean to you?
